

MY HEALTH RECORD OPT OUT PERIOD 16TH JULY TO 15TH OCTOBER 2018

More than five million Australians already have a My Health record, which provides a summary of their health information, delivering better health outcomes for patients and their treating doctors and specialists.

Every Australian will have a My Health record created for them, unless they choose not to have one during the 3 months opt out period that will run from 16th July to 15th October 2018. The My Health record system and opt out process has the full support of all state and territory governments and peak bodies who unanimously agreed to this plan in August 2017 at COAG Health Council.

The protection of patient information is critical and the My Health record system has strong safeguards in place to protect the health data. It is also subject to some of the strongest legislation in the world to prevent unauthorised use.

During the opt out period individuals who do not want a record will be able to opt out by visiting the My Health record website www.myhealthrecord.gov.au or by calling 1800 723 471 for phone-based assistance. Australians can cancel their My Health record at any time after the end of the opt out period—or create one if they opted out.
